Discover the Mysteries of Life





Let's suppose that you live along the beach. One morning you get up early and decide to walk along the sandy shore.

It is a magnificent scene. The rising sun's rays dance off the water. Waves crash on the shore.



As you walk down the beach in quietness, you notice a set of footprints in the sand in front of you.

Then you notice a second and a third set of footprints. You look as far as you can down the beach but you don't see anyone.

What do all these footprints tell you? They say simply this: Although you can't see anyone, someone was there; someone walked down the beach before you.

Let me ask you another question.



If you stand outdoors and look around, what do you see? Grass, trees, hills or mountains, flowers, streams or lakes of water, maybe animals.



In the daytime, you might see the sun, the sky, or clouds.



At night, you might see thousands upon thousands of stars- or perhaps the moon.

And this entire vast universe, including Earth with its delicate ecosystems, is extraordinarily complex.



If you see a house, do you ever assume that somehow the house just made itself?

No. You realize that someone made that house. It obviously had to have been designed and carefully constructed.



If you see a road, do you think the road just made itself – or that someone made it? Even though roads and houses are far simpler than worlds and human life, we know they're too complex to have simply originated by accident.



So just how did this complex world get here? How did YOU get here? Who made you?



Today we're going to look at what the Bible says about the intentional way life began here on this earth.

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We will begin to learn about the God who claims to be the Designer and Creator of everything. The God who claims to be the eyewitness of how this world came into existence. The Bible begins by saying very simply:







But is this brief account of origins really credible? Is there evidence today to point to an intelligent Designer behind the vast universe?



The human body gives us amazing evidence of design and a Designer.



Consider just one part of the human body – the eye:



Scientists tell us that the delicate design of the eye's cornea and lens make even the most advanced cameras on earth seem like a child's toys by comparison.



The eye changes light into messages the brain understands in ways even the most advanced laboratories on earth can't reproduce. Brain cells change these messages into the miracle of sight -adesign even the brightest, most intelligent scientists on earth cannot duplicate or improve upon.



For the eye to have evolved, all of the complex parts and processes would have had to have developed by accident at the same time for it to have been functional and advantageous.

Far more than just utilitarian, the human eye gives evidence of a loving Creator who wants us to see the beauties that He has made in His vast creation.

No wonder the psalmist wrote:



(Text: Psalm 139:14) "I will praise You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made;



Marvelous are Your works, and that my soul knows very well." Psalm 139:14.

Man's body and mind are very complicated and could only have been designed by a very wise Designer.




Just like the footprints on the sand – we knew someone had been there even if we had never seen that person. So when we see things in the natural world that demonstrates design and intelligence and a heart that appreciates beauty, these are like footprints that tell you Someone must exist who made all these things!



Think of the migration of the birds, one of the greatest puzzles of nature.



How can birds weighing less than an ounce navigate thousands of miles nonstop to a destination they have never seen?



Is it any wonder that the Psalmist said,

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Let's take a look at just a few of the ways God cares for the needs of His creatures.

Consider the water you drink. It is older than the pyramids—as old as the hills.



Water may be polluted by chemicals or wastes, but let the sun evaporate or lift it into the atmosphere,



and it becomes clean and usable again and again, distributed by the rain, dew, or snow. What a tremendous water system God designed!



And there is God's great power plant in the sky – our sun! Think for a moment:



If the sun were a little bigger or a little closer to Earth, our oceans would boil away.



If the sun were just a little smaller or a little farther away, our atmosphere would freeze. Either way, life could not exist on Earth. But God not only created all things, He sustains all things!

The air we breathe is a gift of God: The Bible says,



(Text: Job 12:10) "In whose hand is the life of every living thing and the breath of all mankind?" Job 12:10.



NITROGEN OXYGEN ARGON CARBON DIOXIDE God designed the universe, and He knew just the right formula for the air we breathe to sustain life and health on Earth.

He knew the right amount of Nitrogen, Oxygen, Argon, and Carbon Dioxide to mix into the atmosphere.

That certainly couldn't just happen! The evidence points to an intelligent, loving Creator who made us and sustains us, and the Bible tells us that He is entitled to our worship and devotion because He is the Creator.






(Text 4 slides: Revelation 4:10, 11) "The twenty-four elders fall down before Him who sits on the throne and worship Him who

Doesn't it give you peace of mind to know that if God can design and sustain everything in the universe He can help you with the challenges in your personal life?


No problem is too small or too big for Him to handle.

It is staggering to contemplate God's omnipotence, His omniscience, and His omnipresence. But love is something we can understand. And we are assured that there is nothing in all the world that can separate us from God's love! So God then sent His Son. Jesus was the perfect revelation of the personality and character of His Father.





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Who is this God of the Universe?He is the powerful Creator.He is the amazing Provider.He is the incredible Designer.He is the loving Redeemer.



Many years ago a little boy was in a tragic accident. He was rushed to the hospital in critical condition. The boy needed an immediate blood transfusion. No donor could be found. His father had the same blood type and agreed to donate blood. The doctor's began to do a direct blood transfusion from the father's arm to the son.

As the blood flowed directly from his arm through a plastic tube into his son's still, still, body, he looked up at the physician and with tears in his voice said,

"Doctor, if you need to, take it all. Doctor, I am willing to give all my blood for my son."



Our heavenly Father looked at the world He created and saw it lost in sin.

He gave all heaven could give in His son.

Jesus said, "Father, if you need to, take it all. Take every drop of my blood to save my son, my daughter, my friend."



How can you turn away from such love? An all-powerful, loving God made us. When the human race sinned, He gave His all for us. He is worthy of our worship, wouldn't you agree? And the greatest worship we can give is to give Him our hearts. I want to worship Him as my Creator and loving Redeemer tonight, [*raise your hand*] what about you?
