### Introduction

In the year 2000 ASI began the development of the *New Beginnings* DVD evangelism tool. Since that time thousands have used this simple, easy to use set of sermons. Hundreds of thousands have been baptized!

The impact has been phenomenal. Not only have many come to know Jesus for the first time, but many church members have also found a new vigor in their personal lives as they've experienced the joys of soulwinning!

While thousands of the *New Beginnings* DVD has been sold, and the product has been adapted and translated for use around the globe, ASI senses that there is still more that can be done with this resource!

The idea is simple: Engage laity to use the tool in as efficient a model as possible. Bypass the expenses of LCD projectors and hall rental. Inspire members to hold cottage-style small-group meetings in their homes. Give them a DVD and a player and let them use their own TV (or borrow one!). Encourage them to form teams that will involve even more members in the process. Have each member involved in the team be responsible for bringing at least two visitors.

To make this possible, ASI is providing funding for the DVD players and *New Beginnings* DVD discs. You, ASI leaders, will be helping provide the training for these lay church members around the world.

The *Tell the World* initiative of the General Conference aims to have five million church members personally win at least one soul to Jesus during this quinquinium. Alongside ASI the General Conference will be providing additional funds to provide even more discs and players. Imagine what could take place if five million church members around the globe were active in evangelism!

Each training event will be held in cooperation with and under the auspices of the local Conference or Union. While pastors and administrators will be involved in these training events, they will be serving as facilitators, partners with ASI and the General Conference in equipping the lay members of their field.
